

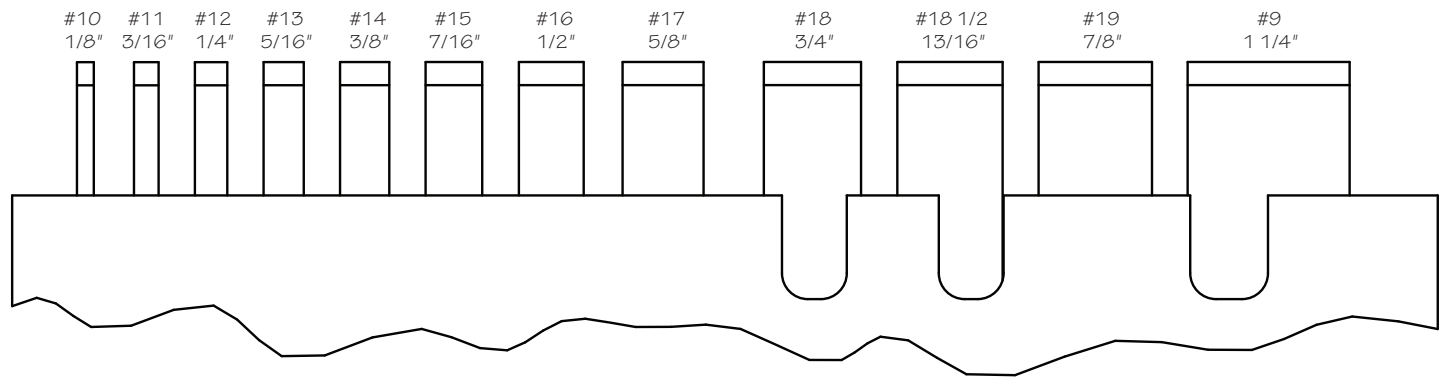
Storage Box for Stanley #45 Plane – Blade Locations

Note: Read before assembling the box.

This storage box for the Stanley #45 Plane accommodates the full set of standard blades from the Stanley #45, as well as its clones*.

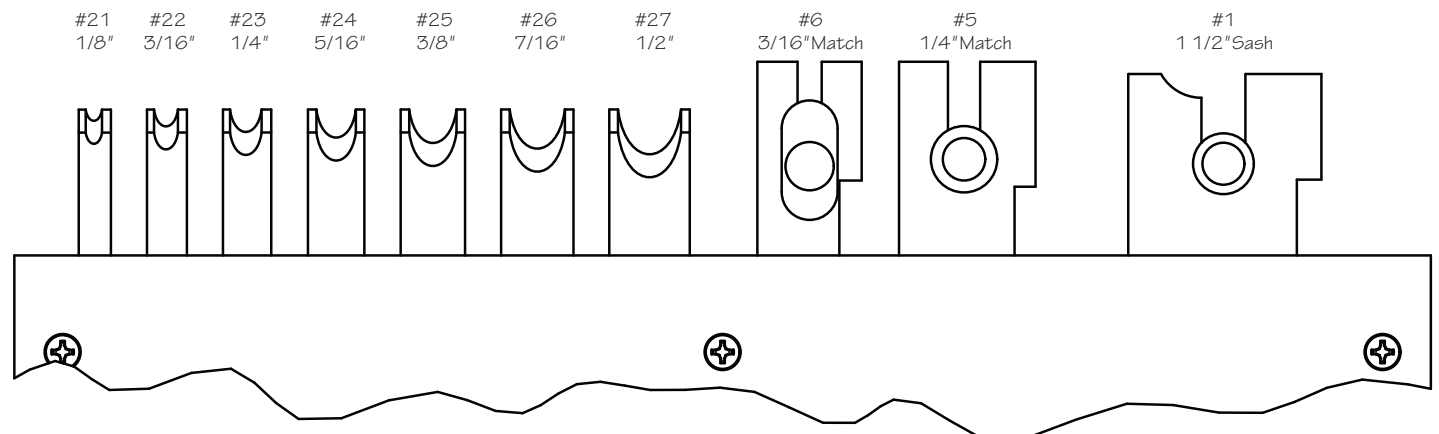
**Note: Stanley #45 blades were manufactured for a number of years in many countries, as well as by a number of other companies. As a result, there is a wide range of widths that differ from the nominal sizes. The slots in the blade holders have been manufactured with a clearance built in; however, it is advisable to test fit your set of blades in the slots before assembly. In rare cases, it may be necessary to widen some of the slots. We suggest cutting through the plywood layers with a shop knife in order to avoid delamination of the plywood.*

The blade holders are arranged into two layers and have individual slots for each blade. The first layer, the one closest to box side, accommodates the straight blades.



The cutouts in the blade holder adjacent to the #18, #18 1/2 and #9 blades are to accommodate the depth stops on the match and sash blades in the second layer.

The second layer holds the beading, match and sash blades as shown below.



When assembling the box, ensure that the narrow slots in each layer are aligned with each other so that the match and sash blades will align with the cutouts in the first layer.
